

Art Lesson Plan

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Lesson: Cave Drawing

Objectives: To create a unique cave drawing.

Materials: Manilla paper, pastels, pencil, colored pencil, coffee.

Focus/Model: Ancient Cave Drawings

Vocabulary: Ancient, Paleolithic, Henges, Neolithic, Megaliths

Procedure: Take your manila paper and begin to sketch a unique cave drawing that tells a story. Then take pastel and colored pencil to add the necessary color. Finally wrinkle the paper and gently tear the edges to give it an aged look. Lastly we will stain the paper with coffee.

Essential Question: What is “Twisted Perspective”?

Evaluation: Did the student show an understanding of the artistic concepts taught? Did the student use time and materials wisely? Did the student follow directions and the guidelines? Did the student create a piece of artwork of personal issue or action?
