Lesson: Watercolor Landscape Project

<u>Objectives:</u> Student is to complete a landscape using proper watercolor techniques. Create a composition that is interesting and appealing. Student is to use all artistic techniques correctly. Student is to follow all directions and guidelines.

Materials: Paper, Pencil, Ruler, watercolor

**Focus/Model:** Claude Monet along with other impressionist artworks

**Vocabulary:** Dry Brush, Impressionism, Washes, Landscape, Pigments

<u>Procedure:</u> Start by drawing your composition in pencil so that you can erase all the extra lines that are not to be painted. Next you should complete your painting by using the watercolor to color your picture. Don't forget to use the different techniques in watercolor

**Essential Question:** What is your favorite watercolor technique demonstrated?

**Evaluation**: Did the student show an understanding of the artistic concepts taught? Did the student use time and materials wisely? Did the student follow directions and the guidelines? Did the student create a piece of artwork of relevance?
